

Gualala Arts' Summer Art Program for Youth



DATES: Tuesday through Friday, July 5 through July 15, 2005

TIME: 9:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.

LOCATION: Gualala Arts Center

COST: \$95 per child for 24 hours of instruction

REGISTRATION: Begins immediately and closes June 17 (or when full)

All coastal children are invited to participate in this year's **Summer Art Program for Youth**, sponsored by Gualala Arts. This program has been extremely popular in its past 15 years and area students wishing to participate are encouraged to sign up as soon as possible. Preschoolers will receive a 3-hour Art & Physical Education program taught by Lena Bullamore. Students in grades 1 through 6 are offered a choice of two consecutive classes of 1½ hours each.

COMING AND GOING... Children must be signed in and out every day. Children should arrive at Gualala Arts Center at 9:30 a.m. (9:15 a.m. the first day). They are supervised from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., and must be picked up promptly at 12:30 p.m. Each child should bring a snack with his/her name on the container each day.

PRE-SCHOOL AGES 3, 4, 5

Art and Physical Education ~ taught by Lena Bullamore. This self-contained class, with indoor and outdoor activities, is directed by a fine teacher who is well-known on our coast for her many years of working with young children. In this 3-hour program, children will participate in movement, drama, games, music and visual art, all in a safe environment that encourages creativity in art and body awareness in movement.

GRADES 1 – 2 – 3, AND GRADES 4 – 5 – 6

The classes described below are offered to students in groups of grades 1-2-3, and grades 4-5-6. Students enroll in two 1½-hour classes, for a total of three hours each day. Choose among:

Ceramics ~ taught by Darshan Hodges. Darshan will help students create marine animals in clay, plates, mugs, mobiles and other creations with slab work on balloons. Students will experience glazing techniques with Darshan's home-created glazes.

Drama ~ taught by Anna Dobbins. Students will learn about acting in a safe supportive atmosphere. This year's group will work toward a small production of their own with personal monologs and or stories.

Creative Arts and Crafts ~ taught by Gerda Randolph. Students in this class will explore a variety of craft projects including felting, weaving, rock painting and the making of puppets, beads, sculptures, mazes, picture wheels and thaumatropes. Activities will be designed to encourage the unique creativity of each child.

Environmental Art ~ taught by Zola de Firmian. In this class, students will dig-in to fun, hands-on experiences using natural materials and "found objects" from the environment. Appreciation for natural resources while creating from the heart will be our theme. We'll make paper, cast assemblages, mobiles, and kites, while discovering more about nature's gifts.

Culinary Art ~ taught by David 'Sus' Susalla. Students will learn the art of basic kitchen health and safety, how to set a table, create a menu, prepare and serve it. For their grand finale, the children will set and decorate tables, and prepare delicacies for their parents and guests to enjoy.

Drawing and Painting- Practice Techniques of Famous Artists ~ Instructor to be announced. Each day become a famous artist and practice a technique that made you famous. Paint to music like Kandinsky and Klee, applying color and shapes in non-realistic, abstract ways. Stretch your imagination. Create paintings using surrealistic techniques liked those of Dali and Magritte.

ABOUT THE INSTRUCTORS...

Lena Bullamore has been involved in teaching young children since 1966. She has teaching experience in public school as well as serving as director of the Point Arena Little School for six years, which provided a creative, dynamically diverse curriculum for 4- and 5-year-olds. Recently she has held "Fairytale Workshops" for kids ages 3 through 7.

Darshan Hodges is an award-winning children's ceramic teacher. She has been involved in ceramics for many years, has taught here on the Mendocino Coast for 12 years, including 4 years for the Gualala Arts' Summer Art program.

Anna Dobbins has been involved in local theatre since 1983, studied acting with Leslie Lindborg and participated in many acting workshops with other accomplished drama coaches. She has acted in several stage productions, directed three productions of the ARC Light and Talent Show. Coaching and encouraging young performers has been a special delight for many years.

Gerda Randolph is an experienced teacher. She enjoys using arts and crafts to support learning and inspire creativity. A recent member of our community, she is pleased to be involved with Gualala Arts Summer Arts Program again this year.

Zola de Firmian is a new local elementary teacher who instills love for learning through connection with nature and the arts. She has a B.A. in Humanities with an emphasis in Art, and a M.S. in Education. She presented environmental poetry and arts workshops for educators via the River of Words program in Marin Country.

David 'Sus' Susalla has been cooking since the age of 4, when he asked his mother for an easy-bake-oven and she replied, "Oh honey, I'll teach you to use the real thing!" He has been cooking ever since. In the early 1990's he was responsible for weekly cooking programs for 5-12 year olds. Recently he has been involved in the Culinary Arts Guild and Dinners @ 6.
