

## Gualala Arts' Summer Art Program for Youth



DATES: Tuesday through Friday, July 7 - 10, 2009
Tuesday through Friday, July 14 - 17, 2009

TIME: 9:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. (9:15 a.m. first day 7/7)

LOCATION: Gualala Arts Center

COST: \$150 per child for two week session

(\$75 scholarships available on a first-come basis; request in writing with application)

REGISTRATION: Begins immediately and closes June 26 (or when full). Registration forms are available at the Gualala Arts Center, the Dolphin in Gualala, Everything Under the Sun in Point Arena, or on-line at GualalaArts.org. **EARLY REGISTRATION IS ADVISED.** 

All children are invited to participate in this year's **Summer Art Program for Youth**, sponsored by Gualala Arts. This program has been extremely popular in its' past 18 years, and area students wishing to participate are encouraged to sign up as soon as possible. Preschoolers will receive a 3-hour Art & Physical Education program taught by Lena Bullamore. Students in grades 1 through 6 are offered a choice of two consecutive classes of 1½ hours each.

COMING AND GOING... Children must be signed in and out every day. Children should arrive at Gualala Arts Center at 9:30 a.m. (9:15 a.m. the first day). They are supervised from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., and <u>must be picked up promptly at 12:30 p.m.</u> Each child should bring a snack with his/her name on the container each day.

#### PRE-SCHOOL AGES 3 – 4 – 5

Art and Physical Education ~ taught by Lena Bullamore. This self-contained class, with indoor and outdoor activities, is directed by a fine teacher who is well-known on our coast for her many years of working with young children. In this 3-hour program, children will participate in movement, drama, games, music and visual art; all in a safe environment that encourages creativity in art, and body awareness in movement.

#### **GRADES 1 – 2 – 3, AND GRADES 4 – 5 – 6**

The classes below are offered to students in groups of grades 1-2-3, and grades 4-5-6. Students enroll in two 1½-hour classes, for a total of three hours each day. Classes are subject to change. Choose two among:

**Ceramics** ~ Students will create in clay; animals, flower pots, plates, mugs, mobiles and other creations with slab work. Students will experience glazing techniques with home-created glazes.

**Music/Singing** ~ Students will learn about music in a safe supportive atmosphere. This year's group will work towards a recital of their own. Music will be focused on piano, voice, percussion and some history. Students will learn about famous musicians from 1600-present.

**Creative Arts and Crafts** ~ Students in this class will explore a variety of craft projects including felting, weaving, rock painting, making of puppets, beads, sculptures, and picture wheels. Activities will be designed to encourage the unique creativity of each child.

*Irish Dance* ~ Traditional Irish Dancing classes are taught to promote Irish culture in a fun, family like atmosphere. This class will teach the basics of traditional Irish dance including the Reel, Jig, Single Jig and Slip Jig. Students will be encouraged to learn at their own rate.

**Culinary Art** ~ Students will learn the art of basic kitchen health and safety, how to set a table, create a menu, prepare and serve. Students will get to vote on more than half of the cooking projects. This will be a hands-on class, and students will get to take home goodies to share on a few days. Bring ideas and wishes on what types of fruits, vegetables, and cultures you would like to learn about!

**Drawing / Painting / Photography** ~ Each day students will learn various techniques of creating art. Students will travel in time, on Gualala Arts trails, and in the classroom, learning techniques and skills of the past, present and future. A wide variety of media will be explored.

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

Note to Parents: Anyone can get head lice; it is not a sign of poor hygiene. Lice are spread through head to head contact with someone who has lice. Less commonly, they can be spread by sharing items such as hats, combs, and headphones. They are a nuisance, but will not harm your health. Lice are common in day cares and schools. Please, every morning check your child by combing the entire head with a fine tooth comb. Head lice are small insects the size of a sesame seed. They move quickly but do not jump or fly. Lice lay tiny grey/white eggs (nits) which stick to hair. If you should find any, please keep your child at home and notify Gualala Arts. Speak with a pharmacist about which treatment you should use. Gualala Arts will notify all parents if there is any report of head lice.
