Note to Parents: Anyone can get head lice; it is not a sign of poor hygiene. Lice are spread through head to head contact with someone who has lice. Less commonly, they can be spread by sharing items such as hats, combs and headphones. They are a nuisance but will not harm your health. Lice are common in daycares and schools. Please check your child's head especially around the neck and the back of ears. Itching scalps are a common sign of infestation. Head lice are small insects the size of a sesame seed. They move quickly but do not jump or fly. Lice lay tiny grey/white eggs (nits) which stick to hair. If you should find any please keep your child at home and notify Gualala Arts. Speak with a pharmacist about which treatment you should use. Gualala Arts will notify all parents if there is any report of head lice.
