

Gualala Arts' Summer Art Program for Youth



Registration is already in progress and closes June 16 or when full. Call the office at 884-1138 to see if openings are still available. There are still a couple of the \$75 scholarships available for those who qualify. A written application for scholarship can be submitted with the registration.

The dates are **Wednesday through Friday, July 5 through July 7, and Monday through Friday, July 10-14 from 9:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.** at the Gualala Arts Center. Cost per child is \$125.

All coastal children are invited to participate in this year's program sponsored by Gualala Arts. This program has been extremely popular in its past fifteen years.

Children must be signed in and out every day. Children should arrive at Gualala Arts Center at 9:30 a.m. (9:15 a.m. the first day). They are supervised from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., and must be picked up promptly at 12:30 p.m. Each child should bring a snack with his/her name on the container each day.

Pre-School Ages 3, 4, 5 will be given Art and Physical Education taught by Lena Bullamore. This self-contained class, with indoor and outdoor activities, is directed by a fine teacher who is well-known on our coast for her many years of working with young children. In this 3-hour program, children will participate in movement, drama, games, music, and visual art, all in a safe environment that encourages creativity in art and body awareness in movement.

Children in grades 1 – 2 – 3, and grades 4 – 5 – 6 are offered two 1½-hour classes, for a total of three hours each day and choosing among:

Ceramics ~ taught by Darshan Hodges. Darshan will help students create marine animals in clay, plates, mugs, mobiles and other creations with slab work on balloons. Students will experience glazing techniques with Darshan's home-created glazes.

Drama ~ taught by Anna Dobbins. Students will learn about acting in a safe supportive atmosphere. This year's group will work toward a small production of their own with personal monologs and or stories.

Creative Arts and Crafts ~ taught by Gerda Randolph. Students in this class will explore a variety of craft projects including felting, weaving, rock-painting and the making of puppets, beads, sculptures, mazes, picture wheels and thaumatropes. Activities will be designed to encourage the unique creativity of each child.

Environmental Art ~ taught by Nicole Ponseler In this class, students will dig-in to fun, hands-on experiences using natural materials and "found objects" from the environment. Appreciation for natural resources while creating from the heart will be our theme. We'll make paper, cast assemblages, mobiles, and kites, while discovering more about nature's gifts.

Culinary Art ~ taught by David 'Sus' Susalla & the Culinary Arts Guild. Students will learn the art of basic kitchen health and safety, how to set a table, create a menu, prepare and serve it. For their grand finale, the children will prepare delicacies for their parents and guests to enjoy.

Drawing and Painting- Practice Techniques of Famous Artists ~ taught by Barbara Ward-Clark. Each day, become a famous artist and practice a technique that made you famous. Become Michelangelo and paint a "ceiling." Paint a wall mural like Diego Rivera...or paint beautiful close-up detail of a flower like Georgia O'Keefe.

Lena Bullamore has been involved in teaching young children since 1966. She has teaching experience in public school as well as serving as director of the Point Arena Little School for six years, which provided a creative, dynamically diverse curriculum for 4- and 5-year-olds. Recently she has held "Fairytale Workshops" for kids ages 3 through 7.
