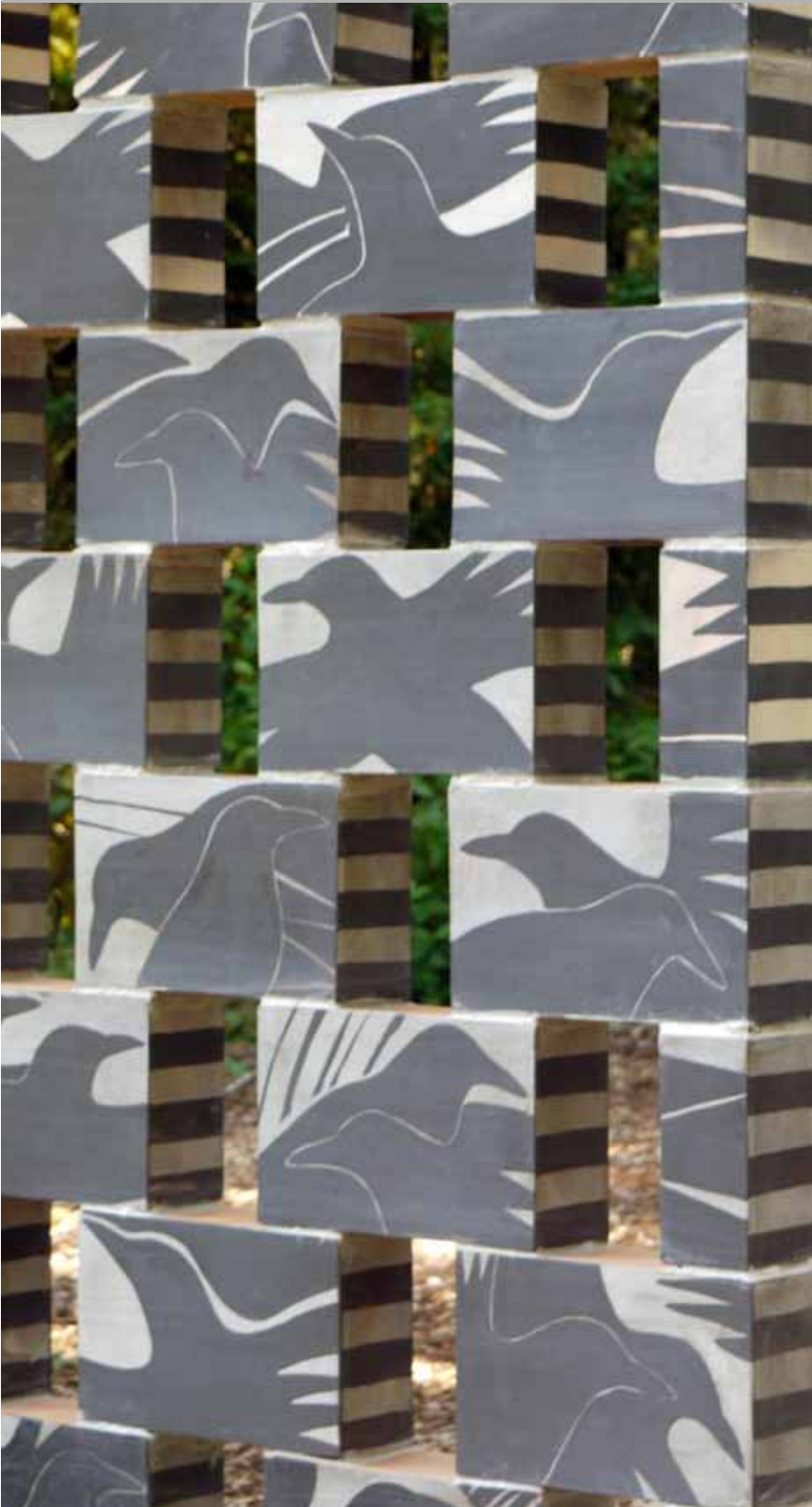

GUALALA ARTS UNVEILS KAZUKO MATTHEWS' RAVENS WALL

Gualala Arts is honored to be unveiling Kazuko Matthews "The Ravens Wall" at its 51st Art in the Redwoods festival. Kazuko Kayasuga Matthews was born in Southern California and was raised in Japan. After returning to the United States, she attended Mt. San Antonio College and Chouinard Art Institute where she studied with internationally known Otto and Vivica Heino. Choosing to leave her graphics career, Kazuko attended Santa Monica College and Scripps College where she devoted herself to her ceramics, studying under Paul Soldner.

"As an observer a sense of spirituality, playfulness and formal design, emanates from Kazuko's "Ravens Wall" on the one side and on the opposite side of the piece I can visualize the roots of life's cycles transcending into the spiritual aspect of the raven" says Kate Skinner.

Kazuko describes her work as being, "events, whether experienced fleetingly or in a small way, bring me joy and excitement. The process of interpreting these feelings becomes exploration for new expression...juxtaposing patterns, and the way I play with the dimensions and the space, are all part of my explorative process".

Be sure to get your tickets early - with all the fun this show promises to bring to the coast, it is sure to sell out!



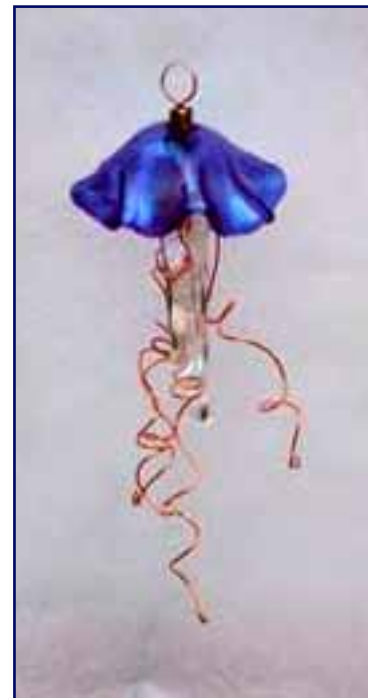

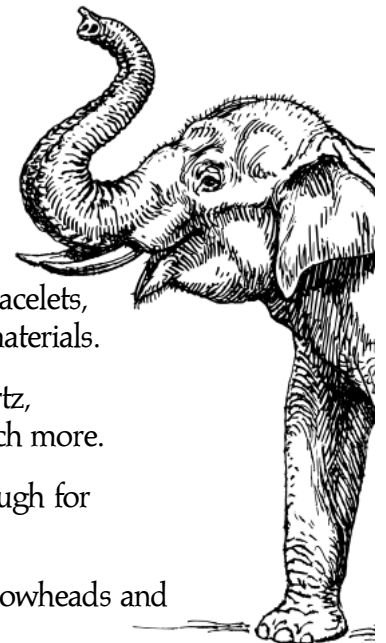

He is among a select group of watercolorists who are signature members of all three major watercolor societies: American Watercolor Society, National Watercolor Society, and Transparent Watercolor Society of America "Master Status". His continuous growth and development in his pursuit of watercolor has enabled him to be a leading artist/educator in the field of watercolor painting.

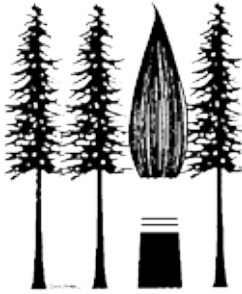
Students in his class will explore conceptual and innovative watercolor approaches that will further develop and enhance their own personal style of painting. A series of exercises, lectures and demonstrations will enable each individual to understand how to apply the elements and principles of design during the process of developing a painting. Emphasis will also be placed on artistic expression in an uninhibited manner. One of the four days of the workshop, students will learn how to develop preliminary studies that are completed on location. Students will then be able to utilize these plein air studies

to pursue their painting assignments indoors at the Gualala Arts Center.

The different painting approaches and concepts introduced will enlighten both traditional and contemporary watercolor artists.

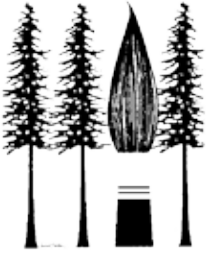

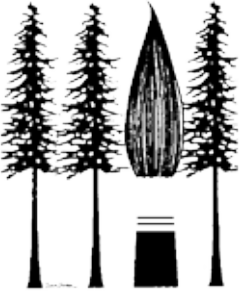

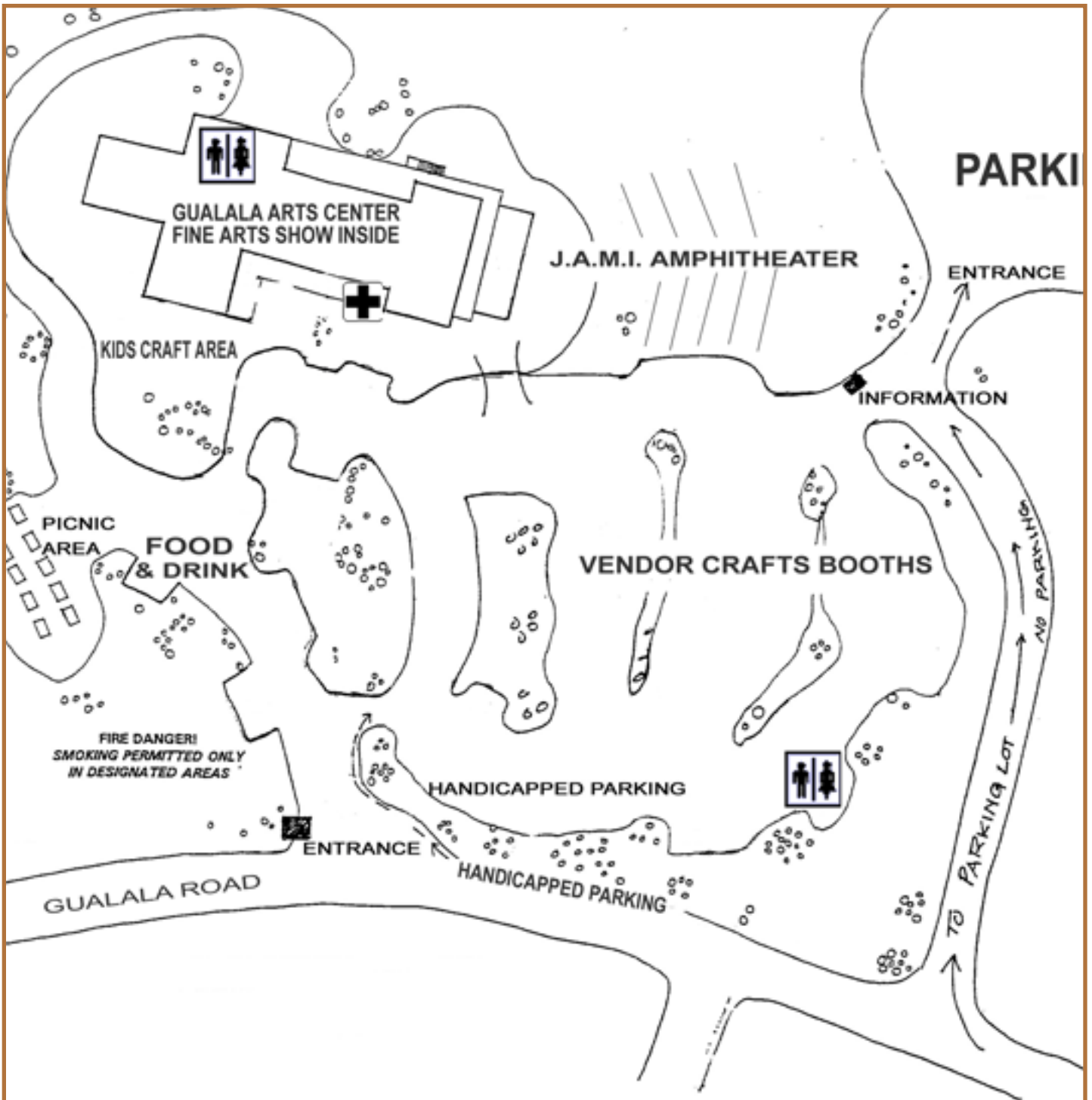
Grand Finale

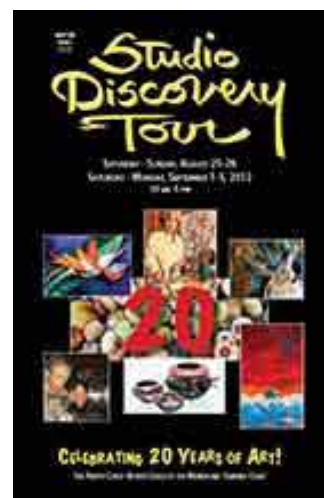

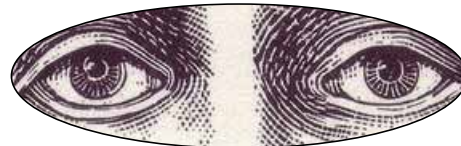
